PURPLE HEART DAY AUGUST 7TH

The Medal of Honor that is now the Purple Heart actually began as the 'Badge of Military Merit.' On August 7th, 1782, General George Washington designed a new badge of distinction for enlisted men and non commissioned officers. They were awarded for 'any singularly meritorious action.' The badge was a figure of a heart in purple cloth or silk, edged with narrow face or binding.

On January 7th, 1931, a new design was reopened for the present medal of the Purple Heart. It consists of a purple enameled heart within a bronze quarter inch border showing a relief profile of George Washington in Continental Uniform. Washington's family Coat of Arms adorns the medal, along with an inscription inside the heart that reads 'For Military Merit.'

Now we celebrate Purple Heart Day on the Anniversary of its inception, August 7th. On this day it is our patriotic duty to remember and recognize those people willing to serve our country, no matter the price.
