COMMANDER'S REMARKS

In 1972, the Chief of Naval Operations, Admiral Elmo Zumwalt, authorized the Navy to celebrate its birth-day on 13 October to honor the establishment of the Continental Navy in 1775. Navy personnel are dedicated pioneers who safeguard our freedoms around the world. As we acknowledge the many members of our Legion who have served with distinction in the Navy, we are privileged to extend our sincere congratulations to the Navy on its 251st Anniversary.

The coolness in the air marks the transition between seasons. Early in the month, we commemorate Oktoberfest, with Halloween taking place at its conclusion. Of particular note, the Fall Conference will once again be held in Columbia Oct 30th-Nov. 1st This event is of considerable importance to all Commanders throughout our distinguished state, as it serves a vital function in supporting every Legion. I intend to participate in this conference to further develop my capabilities as a Legionnaire and to provide a visible and active representation of our organization at the state level again.

Last month, I received direct feedback for the first time regarding the locking of the Legion doors. This concern was raised in connection with a complaint submitted to Columbia via email. The issue has been addressed with measures in place to protect the complainant's anonymity. While I understand the inconvenience this may cause, these actions are necessary to ensure the security of our PLC.

Several members have inquired about the possibility of parking vehicles marked "For Sale" on Legion property. As a point of consideration, one might reflect on whether it would be appropriate to request parking privileges for such purposes at a church. It is important that we maintain the aesthetic integrity of our building and honor the legacy of former members who dedicated significant effort to establishing this Post. These measures are implemented with the intention of preserving our heritage while planning for a responsible future all for the good of the Legion.

The rich culture and integrity of our Post remain central to my vision for the future. My primary objective is to ensure that this esteemed institution is preserved for generations to come. By working collaboratively, we strive to create an American Legion that welcomes all Veterans and their families. The changes implemented are designed not to diminish the significance of our Post, but rather to further strengthen the culture we value.
